Gemma New joins the BBC Scottish Symphony Orchestra for Mendelssohn's musical retelling of Shakespeare's story performed with extracts from the play for dramatic context – after equally colourful musical storytelling from forgotten French late- Romantic composer Mel Bonis and the heavenly sounds of Mozart's Clarinet Concerto.
